Things to see and do around Hoodoo Ski Area:

Hoodoo Ski Area sits on the summit of Oregon's Santiam Pass, just 44 miles west of Bend, 90 miles east of Eugene and Corvallis and 140 miles southeast of Portland.

See the Oregon Cascades and visit central Oregon by heading out Highway 20 to Sisters, Bend and beyond. From Bend, you can tour Century Drive and see the Cascades up close or head east and get a flavor of the sage covered desert. Head south on Highway 97 to the High Desert Museum, Sunriver and La Pine, then turn west on Highway 58 through Oakridge and Eugene.

If you really feel adventurous, head further south and enjoy Crater Lake or the Klamath Falls area. Glass Buttes is a great place to find obsidian and is located off Highway 20, approximately 60 miles east of Bend.

There is great hiking, biking, fishing and sightseeing nearby so be sure to take advantage of all this beautiful area has to offer. Check out the enclosed "stuffer" sheet for more info.

EQUIPMENT:

Bows: Longbows ONLY with traditional or reverse handles. String must not touch limbs between nocks when strung. 1,2, and 3 piece reflex or reflex/deflex longbows are allowed, however, the riser and limbs must principally be comprised of wood (no metal or carbon graphite risers allowed; fiberglass or carbon overlay laminates are permitted). All bows must shoot directly off the arrow shelf; elevated rests and/or any type sights are strictly prohibited. Arrows: Wood shafting, feather fletch and two blade broadheads only for trail & novelty animals. Flu-Flu with field points for bow birds.

Commercialism & Display of Equipment:

- ◆ Persons are encouraged to display and sell traditional archery equipment and related accessories.
- ◆ You must be registered for the shoot in order to display any items for sale, even those housed at your or another vendor's campsite.
- ◆ Limited discrete and tasteful signs allowed.
- ◆ No electronic display (video) allowed.
- ◆ Nothing using the NALS name or logo may be made or sold except by host club or Rocky Mountain Longbow Association.
- ◆ Only the host club is authorized to sell NALS apparel, which will be available on site.
- ◆ Vendors must provide their own tables and chairs.
- ◆ Door prizes gratefully accepted with donor recognition.
